Implementation, Monitoring and Reporting

The PSEA Network is the point of reference to coordinate activities between partners and will work collaboratively with Safeguarding Resource and Support Hub (RSH)⁴ to build capacity on PSEA and develop/disseminate relevant resources. Each entity is responsible for maintaining and mainstreaming internal mechanisms and procedures in its programmatic, operational and human resource management activities.

The PSEA action plan has a compendium of activities that organisations/agencies are accountable for at agency level and collectively as the PSEA Network. The indicators reflect PSEA performance areas for each agency/organisation guided by the minimum operating standards (MOS-PSEA) and activities that will be undertaken collectively as the PSEA Network. All agencies/organisations will compile information on PSEA activities/indicators through their PSEA focal points on a quarterly basis using a reporting template/questionnaire provided.

Reporting requirements include;

- a. Notification from agencies/organisations to the RC when an allegation has been received concerning their personnel or IP;
- b. Quarterly reports on agency/organisation specific actions on PSEA which will be compiled by the RCO for the UNCT and HCT;
- c. Bi-annual mapping for the IASC global dashboard that tracks progress on implementation of PSEA within humanitarian responses at country-level;
- d. Response Planning and Reporting (RPM) platform/system of the HRP. There are two core indicators that will be monitored through the HRP;
 - Number of organizations that have PSEA integrated in their codes of conducts, signed by their personnel, and covered in internal mandatory trainings (*Core HRP Indicator*)
 - Number of partners with functional Complaints and Feedback Mechanisms available to population receiving assistance (*Core HRP Indicator*)
- e. Annual certification overarching management of the RC to the Secretary General.
