Core Principles to Protect from Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (SEA)

1 Zero Tolerance

SEA constitutes acts of gross misconduct and are grounds for termination of employment

2 No Sex with Children

Any sexual activity with children (<age 18) is strictly prohibited, regardless of consent or local age of majority

3 Do not hire or bribe anyone for sex

Exchange of money, employment, goods, or services for sex is prohibited, including hiring and soliciting commercial sex workers

4 No Sex with Beneficiaries

Any sexual relationship with beneficiaries involving improper use of rank or position is prohibited

5 Always report SEA

Humanitarian/development workers **must** report any concerns of SEA by a fellow aid worker regardless of affiliation to **iraq-psea@un.org**, and are protected from retaliation

6 Create an environment free from SEA

All humanitarian/development workers must create and maintain an environment free from SEA and promote their Code of Conduct

Key Messages to Protect from Sexual Harassment (SH)

1 Prevention First

SH can take many forms, from inappropriate jokes to rape and attempted rape. SH constitutes an act of **misconduct** and every organization should take action to **prevent SH**

2 SH can happen anywhere

SH can happen inside or outside a workplace and work hours, and may be perpetrated by or target any colleague, of any status or gender

3 No Impunity

All organizations need policies and processes to ensure survivors are supported and perpetrators face **consequences**

4 Survivors first

In line with a survivor-centered approach, survivor rights, needs, and preferences are central in any process and service

Support & Assist Survivors

A survivor has the **right** to timely, sensitive, confidential, and impartial support and assistance

6 Respectful workplace

Staff should treat each other with courtesy and respect, be aware of how their behavior may be perceived, and take action with victim consent
