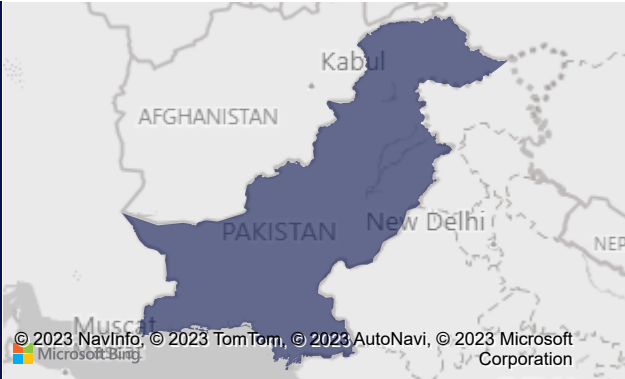


Key Actions

1. Introduced IP assessment tool and monthly online reporting in 2021.
2. Provided contextualized SOPs for CBCM and conducted PSEA risk assessment in flood context.
3. Decentralized coordination structure to sub-national level and developed trained PSEA messages and IEC materials.
4. Established trained PSEA focal persons, UN IPs, frontline workers, and provincial/district capacities for flood response, engaging local population on PSEA.

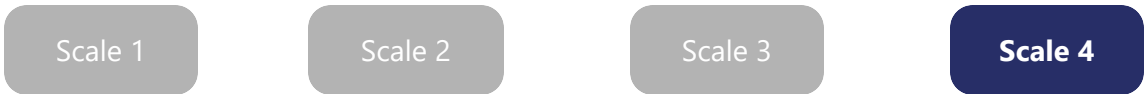
