## Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (SEA)

### A survivor-centred approach

If a SEA incident is reported to you, use a survivor-centred approach by practicing:

#### RESPECT:

all actions you take are guided by respect for the survivor's choices, wishes, rights and dignity.

#### SAFETY:

the safety of the survivor is the number one priority.

#### CONFIDENTIALITY:

people have the right to choose to whom they will or will not tell their story. Maintaining confidentiality means not sharing any information with anyone.

#### NON-DISCRIMINATION:

providing equal and fair treatment to anyone in need of support.

**NOTE:** PSEA Focal Points and service providers should not investigate SEA allegations themselves - doing so could disrupt due process and tamper with evidence.

- If health services exist, always provide information on what is available.
- Share what you know, and most importantly explain what you do not.
- Let the survivor decide if she or he wants to access these services.
- Receiving quality medical care within 72 hours can prevent transmission of sexually transmitted infections, and within 120 hours can prevent unwanted pregnancy.
